Questions to a Potential Respite Provider During an Interview

Remember to use active listening skills: stay focused, really listen, allow for silence, repeat or paraphrase, and understand the emotions behind the words.

Tell me about yourself. (What do you like to do in your free time? Tell me about your education. What do you do with your friends?)

What kind of experience do you have working with a person with a disability?

If the care recipient requires help with personal care, describe some of the personal care that is needed. What experience do you have with personal care?

What was one of your proudest moments?

What was one of your most frustrating moments and how did you handle it?
