With her focus on person-centered care and a unique model for respite, her program was recognized by ARCH National Respite Network and Resource Center in 2019 as one of 13 nation-wide 2019 Innovative & Exemplary Respite Services (the only one in WI that year).

- "Caring for Challenging Behaviors" – Created and leads a four-hour training program on working with children and adults with challenging behaviors. Conducts this training throughout the state to caregivers, parents, and professionals.
- Adventure Education & Team Building – Leads a variety of team building and experiential education sessions for children, young adults, and professional adult groups. Sessions are customized based on individual group goals and objectives.
- Disability Specific and Adaptive Recreational Workshops - Developed and presents workshops around disability specific topics and adaptive recreation.
