





NATIVE AMERICAN CAREGIVERS

Many Natives distrust the majority culture and government due to a history of poverty, displacement, and discrimination. As a result, caregivers are more reluctant to use formal supportive services (Scharlach et al., 2006).

Rural tribal communities are geographically isolated from care services and resources. This exacerbates health disparities and adds to a lack of caregiver training.

LGBTQIA family caregivers have challenges and resiliencies unique to their identities.

According to the Diverse Elders Coalitions, many people who identify as LGBTQ+ rely on families of choice to provide care.

- Four times less likely to have children and twice as likely to be single
- LGBTQ+ caregivers make up around 9% of the caregiving population
- LGBT adults become caregivers at a much higher rate than the general caregiving population (AARP & National Alliance for Caregiving, 2015).

This document is a component of the 2022 National Strategy to Support Family Caregivers (Strategy), which was developed by the RAISE Act Family Caregiving Advisory Council and the Advisory Council to Support Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (SGRG) (collectively, the Advisory Councils) The Strategy empowers communities, agencies, and other stakeholder groups to select actions for implementation, based on community and family caregiver needs and preferences and in consideration of existing supports already in place, resource constraints, and other factors.
