#### Resource/info for AFCSP



**Alzheimer's Family & Caregiver Support Program (AFCSP)**This program was created to enhance the lives of informal and family caregivers while helping people with dementia remain living in the community as long as possible.

#### HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

Funds are available in each county for qualified individuals to provide temporary caregiver respite care and purchase goods and services needed to help care for someone with irreversible dementia.

#### WHAT CAN THE PROGRAM PROVIDE?

#### Typical goods and services include:

- Respite care or home care services (personal care assistance, meal prep, medication assistance and monitoring, homemaker services, yard work, snow removal, etc.)
- · Emergency response systems
- · Transportation expenses
- · Incontinence supplies
- · Home safety modifications
- Home-delivered meals
- Specialized clothing
- Activities and hobby supplies
- · Legal expenses related to guardianship
- · Caregiver counseling services
- · Caregiver education classes
- Individualized services as approved

Caregiver support groups & caregiver education opportunities are also provided in each community. Contact your local Aging & Disability Resource Center or Alzheimer's organization for events in your area.

**NOTE:** AFCSP is available to families not participating in Medicaid LTC programs. Limited caregiver supports & education opportunities may be available to any family caregivers and friends.

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- 1. There is a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease or other dementia
- The person with dementia resides in a community or home setting
   The person with dementia and spouse has a gross annual income of \$48,000 or less (costs related to dementia-related care may be deducted when calculating gross income)

# **Caregiver Respite Grant Program:**

You likely devote a lot of time and energy to caring for a loved one with disabilities, special needs, or cognitive impairments, but you must take care of yourself, too! How can you give your best to the people you love if you are not your best? The Caregiver Respite Grant Program (CRGP) is here to help you do that. The Caregiver Respite Grant Program provides financial support for family caregivers for up to 5 days of respite care within 30 days of application approval. This grant allows approved applicants to hire the respite care provider of their choice for the care recipient.

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#### **Relative NFCSP and Relative Caregiver Support**



#### **Relative Caregiver Program**

NFCSP provides information, support, and other resources to help grandparents and other older relatives who have taken on the responsibility of surrogate parenting due to the absence of the parents.

#### WHAT CAN THE PROGRAM PROVIDE?

Limited short-term respite, services and items that help provide care including:

- Child care
- Extra-curricular school activity fees and supplies
- Tutoring or educational aids
- Summer camps
- Transportation
- Home modifications to create a safe environment
- Equipment and supplies necessary to care for the child
- Adaptive equipment or assistive technology for the caregiver such as raised toilet seat, grab bars, emergency response system, etc.
- Legal expenses related to establishing guardianship or custody
- Individualized services as approved that assist the relative in caring for the child

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

The following criteria must be met to qualify:

- Must be a grandparent or other relative of the child
- Must be age 55 or older
- Must be the primary caregiver of the child
- Child must be under 18 years of age
- Must live with the child

#### HOW DO I APPLY?
