The National Respite Care Provider Training (NRCPT) helps prepare a skilled, confident workforce. A respite registry builds on that foundation by connecting trained providers with family caregivers seeking support.

WHY REGISTRIES MATTER

For States & Systems

- Implement infrastructure that connects supply and demand
- Maximize investment in training by increasing provider visibility
- Support coordinated, statewide access to respite care

For Family Caregivers

- Easier access to trained, qualified respite providers
- Increased confidence when selecting care
- Reduced time and stress searching for support

For Respite Providers

- Increased visibility to families seeking care
- Opportunities to apply training and grow experience
- A pathway to connect with meaningful, flexible work

*Training prepares providers. **Registries** make them accessible. Both are essential to strengthening respite care systems.*

TAKE THE NEXT STEP

States & Organizations

- Explore or develop a statewide respite registry.
- Integrate NRCPT completion into registry participation.
- Promote registry use to families and providers.

Family Caregivers

- Ask your state or state agencies if available.
- Seek providers who have completed the NRCPT.

Respite Providers

- Complete NRCPT Training.
- Join your state or local registry (if available).
